


City Installs Vehicle Warning Lights For Applications Requiring

The City of Hobbs' safety program encompasses a comprehensive vehicle safety program for all city owned and operated vehicles. Aside from OSHA required safety training, the Safety Committee oversees



a Near Miss program which provides opportunities to reduce preventable accidents. Through this Near Miss program, a greater number of safety related issues can be identified and addressed.

The City of Hobbs, through our safety responsibility, has listened to our employee's ideas to provide a safer work environment. We have installed warning lights on 42 of the traffic, streets, environmental and utility vehicles. This is the first step in upgrading approximately 105 vehicles. These utility vehicles typically engage in construction, maintenance, inspection, and support various city initiatives. These new lights may display flashing amber warning lights to the front, sides, or rear when necessary, parked on a street or highway or when necessarily moving at a speed slower than the normal flow of traffic and only in accordance with state and city law.

The New Mexico Municipal League (NMML) annual conference took place in Albuquerque on September 2nd through the 4th. NMML is a non-profit, non-partisan association representing 104 New Mexico cities, towns, and villages. As a league member, communities benefit from the many services provided, such as technical research services, legislative advocacy, training and development, publications, and advocacy in multiple arenas where municipal interests are discussed and contemplated.

The conference is an opportunity for all member communities to gather with more than 700 elected officials, managers, and administrative staff to network, engage in discussions of local government management, as well as general sessions and workshops.

The conference offers delegates an opportunity to examine emerging issues, develop new skills and engage in discussions on a variety of topics important to municipal officials and their constituents. It also serves as a forum for attendees to exchange ideas and meet people whose municipalities share common challenges.

In addition to the formal programs, an exhibit hall features more than 50 companies and organizations and serves as a one-stop-shop for municipal officials. Exhibitors present the latest equipment, services and technology for municipal governments. The gathering provides vendors the opportunity for face-to-face contact with the state's top decision makers. A large contingency of City of Hobbs elected officials and staff attended this year's event.

The City of Hobbs will host the 2016 NMML Annual Conference, which is anticipated to bring over 800 people to the community August 31st through September 2nd, 2016.


Warrior Award - Anthony Henry, Engineering
