Call to Order and Roll Call

Mayor Cobb called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m. and welcomed everyone in attendance to the meeting. The City Clerk called the roll and the following answered present:

Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Commissioner Sena delivered the invocation and Commissioner Calderón led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Calderón moved that the minutes of the regular meeting held on May 16, 2016, be approved as presented. Commissioner Buie seconded the motion and

the vote was recorded as follows: Newman yes, Sena yes, Taylor yes, Calderón yes, Buie yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried.

Proclamations and Awards of Merit

There were no proclamations or awards of merit presented.

Public Comments

There were no public comments.

Consent Agenda

Mayor Cobb explained the Consent Agenda and the process for removing an item from the Consent Agenda and placing it under Action Items.

Commissioner Sena moved for approval of the following Consent Agenda Item(s):

Resolution No. 6442 - Approving an Amendment to the Development Agreement with Gold Creek Homes Dated September 8, 2015, Extending the Term to July 22, 2017.

Resolution No. 6443 - Approving a Letter of Understanding with Habitat for Humanity of Hobbs Regarding the Conveyance of Properties Dated October 17, 2011.

Resolution No. 6444 - Approving the Final Plan for Lynch Subdivision No. 2, as Recommended by the Planning Board, Located Southwest of the Intersection of College Lane and Ja-Rob within the Extra-territorial Jurisdiction of the City of Hobbs, Submitted by Elizabeth Lynch.

Commissioner Taylor seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Newman yes, Sena yes, Taylor yes, Calderón yes, Buie yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. A copy of the resolutions and supporting documentation are attached and made a part of these minutes.

Discussion

There were no items presented for discussion.

Action Items

Recommended by the Planning Board, Located Southeast of the Intersection of East Bender Boulevard and North Steven Drive within the Municipal Boundaries of the City of Hobbs, Submitted by CRV Investments, LLC. Mr. Kevin Robinson, Development Coordinator, explained the resolution and stated CRV Investments, LLC., has submitted the Final Plan for Homestead Estates Subdivision. He stated the proposed subdivision is located southeast of the intersection of East Bender Boulevard and North Steven Drive which encompasses +/- 37.67 acres. Mr. Robinson stated one parcel will contain a 240 unit multi-family development and 102 single family residential lots. He stated the Planning Board approved the final plan for Homestead on February 16, 2016.

Mr. Mike Stone, City Attorney, stated Mr. Ryan Voorhees with CRV Investments is present tonight. He stated Mr. Voorhees has developed several great investments in Hobbs.

Commissioner Sena thanked Mr. Voorhees for hiring local laborers for his housing developments. He stated the development will be located in District 2 and these great homes are a big asset to the community.

Mr. Voorhees stated the development will install a drainage feature on City property which will reduce the flooding issue in the area. He thanked the City for being a great partner for his developments in Hobbs.

In response to Commissioner Sena's question, Mr. Voorhees stated that he will inquire about the cameras to insure that they are connected with the Eagle IC. Mr. Voorhees also stated that they have hired a local property manager.

Commissioner Sena moved that Resolution No. 6445 be adopted as presented. Commissioner Calderón seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Newman yes, Sena yes, Taylor yes, Calderón yes, Buie yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. Copies of the resolution and supporting documents are attached and made a part of these minutes.

Mayor Cobb thanked Mr. Voorhees, Mr. Robinson and Mr. Todd Randall, City Engineer, for all their hard work on the Homestead Estates Subdivision project.

Resolution No. 6446 - Authorizing FY 16-17 Funding Appropriations to Economic Development and Marketing Entities and Authorizing the Mayor to Execute Professional Service Agreements with Each Agency. Mr. J. J. Murphy, City Manager, explained the resolution and stated the Economic Development Corporation (EDC), Hobbs Chamber

of Commerce, Hobbs Hispano Chamber of Commerce and the Hobbs African American Chamber of Commerce are great agencies who provide services to the community that the City is unable to undertake.

In response to Mayor Cobb's inquiry, Mr. Murphy stated the funding levels for the economic development and marketing entities are the same as FY 2016 with the exception of funding an additional \$225,502.38 to the EDC for the Airline Subsidy.

Commissioner Buie moved that Resolution No. 6446 be adopted as presented. Commissioner Taylor seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Newman yes, Sena yes, Taylor yes, Calderón yes, Buie yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. Copies of the resolution and supporting documents are attached and made a part of these minutes.

Resolution No. 6447 - Authorizing FY 16-17 Funding Appropriations to Various Social Service Agencies and Authorizing the Mayor to Execute Professional Services Agreements with Each Agency. Mr. Murphy explained the resolution and stated there are various social services agencies who provide services to the community that the City is not able to undertake. He stated the attached resolution lists the various agencies and the amount of funding recommended for each. He stated funding levels for the various social services agencies are the same as FY 2016 with the exception of funding for the Community Drug Coalition in the amount of \$100,000.00.

Commissioner Sena disclosed that his sister, Ms. Elaine Sena, is the Executive Director of My Power, Inc., which is a great non-profit agency.

Commissioner Calderón moved that Resolution No. 6447 be adopted as presented. Commissioner Sena seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Newman yes, Sena yes, Taylor yes, Calderón yes, Buie yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. Copies of the resolution and supporting documents are attached and made a part of these minutes.

Consideration of Bid No. 1548-16 for Main Street Sidewalk and ADA Improvements and Recommendation to Accept Proposal from Abraham's Construction, Inc., in the Amount of \$639,298.00 not Including GRT. Mr. Randall explained the bid and stated the New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) caught an error in the bid process. The bid from Abraham's Construction, Inc., omitted the Affidavit of Bidder, which is a required bid document. Pursuant to the NMDOT, he stated the bid from Abraham's Construction, Inc., is not in compliance with the bid process and the City either needs to award to the second bidder or reject the bid and re-bid the project. Mr. Randall stated the decision before the Commission is whether to award the bid to Entrench, Inc., the second lowest

bidder, or to reject all bids and re-bid the project. He added that this bid has been rejected once in the past.

In response to Mayor Cobb's question, there was no motion to reject the bid.

Commissioner Taylor moved to approve the bid for the Main Street Sidewalk and ADA Improvements and proposal from Entrench, Inc., in the amount of \$679,992.50. Commissioner Sena seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Newman yes, Sena yes, Taylor yes, Calderón yes, Buie yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. A copy of the supporting documentation are attached and made a part of these minutes.

Resolution No. 6448 - Approving a 15% Matching Requirement and Verification of Loan Repayment for Water Trust Board Project 3555-WTB; Water Conservation; Phase II Effluent Reuse Project. Mr. Tim Woomer, Utilities Director, stated the Water Trust Board awarded the 2016 Water Trust Fund loan/grant in the amount of \$586,400.00 to the City of Hobbs for the Effluent Reuse Project. He stated the City's funding request is to proceed with the design of approximately 8.5 miles of reclaimed water pipeline, termed the Northeast Distribution System, including an engineer report on the feasibility of relocating and utilizing the Hardin elevated water tower for reclaimed water storage at H.I.A.P. He stated New Mexico Finance Authority (NMFA) has approved this award and set funding terms at a 40% loan in the amount of \$234,560.00 and a 60% grant in the amount of \$351,840.00. Mr. Woomer stated a local match of 15% which is \$87,960.00 of the awarded amount is a requirement of this fund. He stated the execution of the actual loan/grant agreement will be presented for consideration by the Commission in the form of an ordinance adoption at a later date.

In response to Mayor Cobb's question, Mr. Woomer stated the City will be able to use potable water from the effluent pipeline to care for City parks.

In further reply to Mayor Cobb's question, Mr. Woomer added the loan is for 20 years at .25% interest, which can be paid early if needed.

In response to Mayor Cobb's question, Mr. Matt Hughes, Golf Superintendent, stated the City will save approximately 500 gallons per day at the golf course by using effluent water.

In reply to Mayor Cobb's inquiry, Mr. Woomer stated approximate 100 gallons is used by each residential customer.

Commissioner Calderón moved that Resolution No. 6448 be adopted as presented. Commissioner Buie seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows:

Newman yes, Sena yes, Taylor yes, Calderón yes, Buie yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. Copies of the resolution and supporting documents are attached and made a part of these minutes.

Consideration of Bid No. 1546-16 for the Effluent Pipeline Phase I Modifications and Recommendation to Accept Proposal from DuCross Construction, LLC in the Amount of \$286,514.84 not including GRT. Mr. Woomer stated that in preparing the bid tabulation, the Engineer of Record, Souder Miller & Associates, noted a significant difference in MMX's bid amount and the engineer's estimated cost for materials and installation of fire hydrant assemblies. He stated MMX's has noted an inaccuracy in preparing their bid and is requesting that their bid be withdrawn. Mr. Woomer stated the next lowest bid submitted is from DuCross Construction, of Las Cruces, New Mexico, at \$286,514.84. He explained the bid and stated the scope of work consists of upgrades to the existing 20" reclaimed pipeline extending South to the City's Nadine Facility, including an extension of the existing Memorial Cemetery reclaimed pipeline to Prairie Haven Cemetery. He stated the modification on the pipeline includes the installation of a pressure sustaining/flow regulating control station on the S&H Farm lateral and 12 fire hydrant assemblies along Highway 18, where there is currently no source of water for fire protection.

In reply to Commissioner Buie's inquiry, Mr. Woomer stated the 12 new fire hydrants on Highway 18 may reduce the premium for home insurance to the property owners in the area. He stated the homeowners have been contacted accordingly.

Commissioner Buie moved to approve the bid for the Effluent Pipeline Phase I Modifications and proposal from DuCross Construction in the amount of \$286,514.84 as presented. Commissioner Newman seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Newman yes, Sena yes, Taylor yes, Calderón yes, Buie yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. A copy of the supporting documentation are attached and made a part of these minutes.

Resolution No. 6449 - Authorizing City Staff to Purchase Video Equipment for Recording City Commission Meetings. Mr. Ron Roberts, Information Technology Director, stated the City is proposing two options for the purchase of streaming and/or archived, ondemand video and camera equipment to record City Commission meetings. He stated both options will provide high definition quality video. Mr. Roberts stated Option 1 is with Livestream and would allow live streaming and on-demand archival of meetings and would take 30 days to implement. He stated Option 2 is with Granicus and would additionally allow indexing, or bookmarking, to the archived videos, which would allow for skipping to specific agenda items and would take 60 days to implement. Mr. Roberts stated the breakdown of costs for Options 1 and 2 are itemized as follows:

After a lengthy discussion, Mr. Roberts stated neither Option 1 or 2 will have any commercials as viewers frequently see when using YouTube. He stated both options are for a one-year commitment. Mr. Roberts stated Option 1, with Livestream, is as-is and will only stream and archive the videos with no option to add additional features in the future. Mr. Roberts stated Option 2 with Granicus allows features to be added at a later time for additional fees. He stated the cost presented is for one year and may increase year-to-year so entering into a contract for multiple years would lock the price as presented.

Commissioner Buie stated he has doubts regarding Option 1 due to the possibility of the system not working for the City and \$10,000.00 would be wasted. He stated on the other hand, he did not agree with the recurring cost of \$7,200.00 in Option 2.

Mayor Cobb recommended a motion for Option 1 and if it does not pass, a motion for Option 2 could be made for consideration.

Commissioner Calderón moved that Resolution No. 6449 be adopted accepting Option 1 with Livestream as presented. Commissioner Gerth seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Newman no, Sena yes, Taylor yes, Calderón yes, Buie no, Gerth yes, Cobb no. The motion carried 4 - 3. A copy of the resolution is attached and made a part of these minutes.

Comments by City Commissioners, City Manager

Mr. Murphy welcomed back Mr. Manny Gomez as the new Fire Chief for the City of Hobbs.

Chief Gomez thanked Mr. Murphy and the Commission for the opportunity to again serve as Hobbs Fire Chief and for the confidence they have in him.

Mr. Murphy thanked Mr. Doug McDaniel, Parks and Recreation Director, and Ms. Linda Howell, Golf Course General Manager, and Mr. Matt Hughes, Golf Course Superintendent, for a great Pro-Am Tournament at Rockwind Community Links Golf Course held over the weekend. He also thanked Mr. Roberts and the I.T. staff for the many hours of work spent on the live streaming proposal. Mr. Murphy state he is ready to move forward for more transparency of City business.

Commissioner Gerth congratulated Chief Gomez on his new position. He also thanked Mr. Roberts and his staff for the live streaming proposal.

Commissioner Gerth stated the Pro-Am Tournament was great, and he also thanked the Rockwind Community Links staff for an outstanding job.

Commissioner Sena also thanked Mr. Roberts and his staff for the live streaming proposal for Commission meetings.

Commissioner Sena thanked the non-profit agencies for their partnership with the City and for the services provided to the community.

Commissioner Taylor stated she attended "Fun Day Sunday" this past weekend at Booker T. Washington which was enjoyed by all attendees.

Commissioner Calderón stated he recently attended a Leadership Conference for the schools and that Hobbs was the limelight and topic of conversation by many of the conference attendees.

Commissioner Buie thanked everyone who attended tonight's meeting.

Commissioner Buie gave a remembrance of the D-Day invasion that took place on this date in June of 1944 at 6:30 a.m., and recognized his father who was involved in the military operation.

Commissioner Newman thanked Mr. Roberts and his staff for the live streaming proposal. He also thanked the social service agencies for assisting the community with their services.

Mayor Cobb stated social service agencies are an important part of the community.

Mayor Cobb stated the New Mexico Association of Counties (NMAC) will host the NMAC Conference in Hobbs on June 20 - 24, 2016. He stated this is a time for the citizens of Hobbs to sell and market Hobbs as a friendly community.

Reverend Benny Choice reminded everyone that tomorrow, June 7, 2016, is the Primary Election Day.

Adjournment

Minutes of the work session of the Hobbs City Commission held on Monday, June 6, 2016, at 5:00 p.m. in the City Commission Chamber at City Hall, 200 East Broadway, Hobbs, New Mexico.

Mayor Cobb called the work session to order and welcomed everyone in attendance. The following were present:

Also present were Mr. J. J. Murphy, City Manager, Mr. Mike Stone, City Attorney, Ms. Jan Fletcher, City Clerk and Ms. Mollie Maldonado, Deputy Clerk. Other staff members and public were also present.

Mr. J. J. Murphy, City Manager, stated the Commission has requested staff to present a discussion of the pros/cons regarding the proposed Traffic Ordinance.

<u>Proposed Amended Traffic Fines in the Hobbs Municipal Code Traffic Ordinance</u>. Mr. Efren Cortez, Assistant City Attorney, presented a PowerPoint presentation to the Commission regarding proposed amended traffic fines in the Hobbs Municipal Code Traffic Ordinance. Mr. Cortez explained the ordinance terminology and stated that a "fine" is defined as a monetary criminal penalty paid to the public treasury while a "fee" is defined as a charge for administrative services. He explained the City adopted the New Mexico State Motor Vehicle Code, which means that the New Mexico Legislature sets all of the laws, processes and penalties for violations of traffic laws in Hobbs.

In response to Mayor Cobb's inquiry, Mr. Cortez stated the City is currently enforcing the State Motor Vehicle Code.

In further reply to Mayor Cobb's inquiry, Mr. Cortez stated the City may implement a texting traffic fine by adopting an ordinance once the Uniform Traffic Ordinance (UTO) has been adopted.

Mr. Cortez stated by adopting the UTO, the City would have a measure of flexibility when it comes to handling the caseload at Municipal Court and also addresses issues such as parking and penalty assessments, which the City is currently unable to change. He stated if the City adopts the UTO, it would require repealing our current ordinance and adopting the Uniform Traffic Ordinance 2010 Compilation (current through 2015). Mr. Cortez stated the City would also be required to adopt the Penalty Assessment Program which sets the fines for Penalty Assessment

Misdemeanors. He further stated the UTO provides additional laws that are designed to better address traffic on a local level.

In response to Commissioner Sena's question, Mr. Cortez stated the UTO will allow the municipality to raise or lower penalties.

Mr. Cortez explained the "Do's" and "Don'ts" and stated the UTO allows the City Commission to periodically reassess the fines for Penalty Assessment Misdemeanors and either raise them or lower them as needed. He also explained the UTO does not allow any penalties for Traffic Misdemeanors to exceed the "Maximum Penalty" allowed by the Hobbs Municipal Code Section 1.16.010(A).

Mr. Cortez stated adopting the UTO is constitutional and allowable by statute. He stated the traffic misdemeanor fines will be determined by the Hobbs Municipal Judge but cannot exceed "maximum penalty" and penalty assessment misdemeanor fines will be determined by the Hobbs City Commission. Mr. Cortez stated NMSA 1978 requires the City to assess certain fees deemed "court costs" for every case that is adjudicated in the Hobbs Municipal Court as follows:

- \$ 20.00 Correction fee Municipal Treasury; and
- \$ 3.00 Judicial Education fee State Treasurer; and
- \$ 6.00 Court Automation fee State Treasurer.

Mr. Cortez stated for traffic cases under the UTO only, then NMSA 1978 requires the Court to also assess a \$10.00 penalty assessment fee which goes to the Municipal Treasury.

In reply to Mayor Cobb's question, Mr. Cortez stated fees collected on penalties do have restrictions on how the municipality may spend those funds.

Ms. Shannon Carter, Municipal Court Administrator, presented a PowerPoint presentation to the Commission regarding the duties of the Municipal Court. She stated Municipal Court is a Court of limited jurisdiction that hears criminal petty misdemeanors, traffic violations and code offenses. Ms. Carter stated she previously worked for the District Court for ten years and stated it was very structured when hearing cases. She stated implementing a Traffic Violations Bureau (TVB) can bring the same type of structure needed for the Hobbs Municipal Court. She stated "Live Court" is held at Municipal Court every day, except Thursday, at 1:00 p.m. Ms. Carter stated when the doors open at 1:00 p.m., there are people lined up from the Clerk's counter all the way outside the building. She further stated once the Court receives the maximum capacity, individuals are told to come back the next day with the same process in mind, which creates frustration.

Ms. Carter stated Article XI of the UTO establishes a TVB "to assist the Municipal Court in its administrative work." She stated the TVB allows the Municipal Judge to:

- Determine which Traffic Misdemeanors are payable as fines;
- Determine the amount of the fines for Traffic Misdemeanors (not to exceed \$329);
- Determine a suitable schedule for increased fines for first, second, and third offenses of the same Traffic Misdemeanor; and
- Determine at which numbered offense a court appearance will be mandatory. For example:

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No Insurance 1<sup>st</sup> Offense - $129;
No Insurance 2<sup>nd</sup> Offense - $179;
No Insurance 3<sup>rd</sup> Offense - $229;
No Insurance 4<sup>th</sup> Offense–Mandatory Court Appearance
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Ms. Carter stated the TVB is a Court Order by the Municipal Judge setting out these provisions and enforced by the Clerks of the Hobbs Municipal Court that handle traffic cases. She stated by implementing the TVB, it would allow new hours for the acceptance of all payments, pleas, and waivers that are normally done by the Judge. Ms. Carter stated it will be more efficient and cost effective and there will be no need for additional staff or building expansions.

In response to Mayor Cobb and Commissioner Sena's inquiry, Ms. Carter stated the TVB is made up of the Court Clerks who will have the authority vested by the Judge. She stated additional staff and building expansion will not be needed to convert to a TVB. Ms. Carter further stated that the TVB essential provides a clerical process to handle some of the caseload.

In reply to Commissioner Taylor's inquiry, Ms. Carter stated a person may plea guilty to the TVB but would then be placed on the docket to visit with the Judge.

In response to Commissioner Newman's question, Ms. Carter stated the TVB would also decrease the amount of time spent in court by police officers.

Mr. Michael Walker, Police Captain, presented a final segment of the PowerPoint presentation to the Commission regarding the Hobbs Police Department Traffic Patrol. He stated HPD currently enforces traffic violations by setting speed trailers at different locations and with motor units. Captain Walker stated HPD also implemented public education with the "Slow Your Roll" campaign that was established in March, 2014. He also stated that 130 Traffic Calming Packets have

been distributed in the community. Captain Walker displayed a map which designates where all the pledges have been made for the "Slow Your Roll" campaign. He stated 20,578 citations were issued in 2014-2015 of which 6,023 were speeding citations. Captain Walker reviewed the current fees and stated the City could increase the charge by \$10.00 if the UTO is adopted. He also reviewed the current and proposed fines as follows:

<u>Violation</u>	<u>Current</u>	<u>Proposed</u>
Speeding	\$15 to \$150	\$45 to \$180
No Driver's License	\$25	\$80
Expired Registration	\$10 or \$45	\$70
Stop Sign/Red Light	\$10	\$45
Child Restraint/Seatbelt	\$25	\$45
Following Too Close	\$10	\$45

Captain Walker stated the dollar amounts do not include the "Fees" previously discussed. He stated the Total Penalty Assessments are as follows:

<u>Violation</u>	<u>Current</u>	<u>Proposed</u>
Speeding	\$44 to \$179	\$84 to \$219
No Driver's License	\$54	\$109
Expired Registration	\$39 or \$74	\$99
Stop Sign/Red Light	\$39	\$84
Child Restraint/Seatbelt	\$54	\$84
Following Too Close	\$39	\$84

Captain Walker also reviewed the comparisons with proposed fines of what other New Mexico municipalities charge with Hobbs being the lowest in fines and fee collections.

In reply to Mayor Cobb's inquiry, Mr. Cortez stated the State Motor Vehicle Code would have to be repealed entirely and the UTO adopted by ordinance.

Captain Walker stated increasing fines can be a deterrent to people for violating traffic laws. He stated the UTO will be a trial and error process to determine how effective it is in the community.

Commissioner Buie thanked Mr. Cortez, Ms. Carter and Captain Walker for their extensive time and efforts on the proposed traffic fines and fees. He agreed that the TVB would help the Court assist people in a timely manner.

Mayor Cobb thanked everyone for attending the work session and for the presentations. There being no further discussion by the Commission, the meeting adjourned at 6:00 p.m.

ENCROACHMENT AGREEMENT

THIS ENCROACHMENT AGREEMENT (hereinafter "Agreement"), entered into this 20th day of June, 2016, between Troy Lee Kinkead, 1315 E. Llano Drive, Hobbs, NM 88240, (hereinafter "Citizen") and the City of Hobbs, New Mexico, a New Mexico Municipal Corporation (hereinafter "City").

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, Citizen is the owner of certain real property located southeast of the intersection of N. Oriole Drive and E. Llano Drive in Hobbs, comprising Lot 5, Block 2, Unit Seven, Bel Aire Addition;

WHEREAS, the parties recognize that certain non-habitable improvements have been constructed upon the above described property, which may encroach into the dedicated right- of-way,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the following covenants, premises, and other considerations, the parties agree as follows;

- 1. The City agrees to allow the encroachment of the aforementioned improvements at the location further described in Exhibit A attached hereto on the dedicated right-of-way property, and approve the Encroachment Easement, Exhibit B attached hereto, provided the Citizen complies with the terms of this Agreement.
- 2. <u>City Use of City's Property and City Liability:</u> The City has the right to enter upon the City's Property at any time and perform whatever maintenance, inspection, repair, modification or reconstruction it deems appropriate without liability to the Citizen.
- 3. <u>Citizen's Responsibility for Improvement</u>: The Citizen will be solely responsible for maintenance of the improvement as deemed necessary either by the Citizen or the City. The Citizen will be responsible for paying all related costs of said maintenance. The Citizen agrees to not permit the improvement to become or constitute a hazard to the public health or safety, and to keep the improvement properly maintained. Citizen further agrees not to interfere with the City's use of the City's Property, and to comply with all applicable laws, ordinances and regulations. Citizen agrees that no addition or extension to the improvement will be constructed, without the written consent of the City.
- 4. Removal or Relocation of Improvement: At some time in the future, the City may require the improvement to be removed or relocated from City's Property. Such relocation would occur at such time that the municipal infrastructure within the right of way is required to be reconstructed or widened, as deemed necessary by the City to insure proper and efficient maintenance thereof; or for utility improvements deemed necessary by the City.

- 5. <u>Financial Responsibility for Removal and Relocation</u>: If and when the improvement is required to be relocated in the future, financial responsibility for removal and relocation of the improvement will be the sole responsibility of the Citizen to relocate the improvement from the City's right-of-way property.
- 6. <u>Condemnation of Improvement</u>: If Citizen allows or permits the improvement to become deteriorated or to become a threat to the public health, safety and welfare, the City may institute condemnation proceedings to remove Citizen's improvement from City's Property. If any part of the Citizen's improvement is ever condemned by the City, the Citizen will forego all claims to compensation for any portion of Citizen's improvement which encroaches on City Property.
- 7. <u>Notice</u>: For purposes of giving formal written notice to the Citizen, Citizen's address shall be the address of record for ownership of property, as listed in the official records of the County Clerk's Office for Lea County, New Mexico. Notice may be given to the Citizen either in person or by mailing the notice by certified, return receipt U.S. mail, postage paid. Notice will be considered to have been received by the Citizen, when the return receipt mail card is received by the City.
- 8. <u>Indemnification</u>: The Citizen covenant and agree that they will indemnify and save the City harmless from any and all liability, damage, expense, cause of action, suits, claims or judgments arising from injury to person or death or damage to property on or off the premises, arising or resulting from Citizen's actions, usage and property located on the City right-of-way property. The indemnification required hereunder shall not be limited as a result of the specifications of any applicable insurance coverage. Nothing herein is intended to impair any right or immunity under the laws of the State of New Mexico.
- 9. <u>Term</u>: This Agreement may be terminated by removal of the improvement from the City right-of-way by either party. Termination by either party shall be effective ninety (90) days after mailing by a party of written notice of termination to the other party.
- 10. <u>Binding on Citizen's Property</u>: The obligations of the Citizen set forth herein shall be binding upon the Citizen, his/her heirs, assigns, purchasers and successors and on Citizen's Property, and constitute covenants running with Citizen's Property until released by the City.
- 11. <u>Entire Agreement</u>: This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes any and all other agreements or understandings, oral or written, whether previous to the execution hereof or contemporaneous herewith.
- 12. <u>Changes to Agreement</u>: Changes to this Agreement are not binding unless made in writing and signed by both parties.
- 13. <u>Construction and Severability</u>: If any part of this Agreement is held to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of the Agreement will remain valid and enforceable if the remainder is reasonably capable of completion.

- 14. <u>Extent of Agreement</u>: Citizen understands and agrees that the Citizen is solely responsible for ascertaining whether Citizen's Improvement encroaches upon the property or facilities of any other entity and that by entering into this Agreement, the City makes no representations or warranties that the City's property is the only property affected by the encroachment.
- 15. <u>Attorney's Fees and Costs</u>: In the event this matter is litigated the Court shall award reasonable attorney fees to the prevailing party, notwithstanding in-house counsel represent a party.
- 16. Choice of Law and Venue: This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Mexico. Jurisdiction and venue relating to any litigation or dispute arising out of this Agreement shall be in the District Court of Lea County, New Mexico, only. If any part of this contract shall be deemed in violation of the laws or Constitution of New Mexico, only such part thereof shall be thereby invalidated, and all other parts hereof shall remain valid and enforceable.

Amendment No. 2 SURFACE NONDISTURBANCE LAND USE RESTRICTION OR CONDITION ("LURC")

LURC No. 09-07

- 1. Background and Purpose of LURC. On August 27, 2007 the Commissioner and Rayellen entered into an Agreement to Exchange Land (the "Exchange Agreement"), pursuant to which the Commissioner and Rayellen agreed to exchange land as set forth therein. Pursuant to the terms of that Exchange Agreement, Rayellen will acquire the surface estate of the Land described below in Paragraph 3 (the "Land"), reserving to the State of New Mexico all rights in and to geothermal resources, oil, gas, sand, gravel, caliche, and all other natural resources and valuable natural deposits located in, on, or under the Land as more particularly described below, together with the right to access, lease, prospect or explore for, develop, mine, extract, produce, process, remove, and sell, as more particularly described below (collectively, the "Mineral Rights"). To facilitate development of the Land, Rayellen has requested that the Commissioner, on behalf of the State as owner of the Mineral Rights, covenant not to disturb the surface of the Land other than in the manner set forth in Paragraph 6 below in connection with exploration for, development, exploitation of, production, transportation, and marketing of the oil and natural gas reserved by the State in Patent #4337. Suerte, City, NMJC and District agree to comply with and are bound by all terms and conditions of the Exchange Agreement.
- 2. Mineral Rights. The Commissioner, as manager of the Trust, and specifically of Mineral Rights, is executing this LURC on behalf of the State, which claims ownership of and in the Exchange Agreement has reserved the rights to, all geothermal resources and all minerals of whatsoever kind in, under or upon the Land, including but not limited to oil and natural gas, helium, carbon dioxide, coal and lignite, uranium, brine, copper, iron, lead, tale, barite, gold and silver, precious and semi-precious stones and jewels, caliche, building stones, shale, clay, sand, gravel and rock for crushing, whether or not now known to exist or to have value, of whatever form or type, at whatever

depth, in whatever nature of deposit, whether solid, semi-solid, liquid, or gaseous, whether similar or dissimilar to any of those minerals enumerated, and regardless of the method of extraction whether by wells (including input wells), mining by subterranean, open-pit, or strip mines, surface or subsurface leaching, or any other means now or hereafter known or employed, together with all rights of access and surface use necessary for or reasonably incident to exploration for and extraction and removal of the minerals or geothermal resources, the right to execute leases for mineral or geothermal development and operation, the right to sell or dispose of the minerals or geothermal resources, the right to grant rights-of-way and easements for mineral or geothermal purposes, the right to prospect for, mine, produce and remove minerals and geothermal resources and the right to perform any and all acts necessary in connection therewith, all of such together being the Mineral Rights.

3. Land. The Land covered by this LURC is:

Pt. of SW ¼ NE ¼, Pt. NE ¼ NW 1/4, NW ¼ NW ¼, SW ¼ NW ¼, Pt. SE ¼ NW 1/4, SW ¼ in Section 17, Township 18 South, Range 38 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, less and except 4.0 acres described as follows:

A certain tract of land lying and being situated within the SW ¼ NE ¼ of Section 17, Township 18 South, Range 38 East, N.M.P.M., being more particularly described as follows: Beginning at a point 75 feet to the right of and opposite center line Sta. 294+65.1 of FAP 197-A, Lea County, State of New Mexico; thence N 39° 42' W, along the right of way line of said project a distance of 834.8 feet; thence N 50° 18' E, a distance of 208.7 feet; thence S 39° 42'E, a distance of 834.8 feet; thence S 50° 18' W, a distance of 208.7 feet to the point and place of beginning, containing 4.0 acres, more or less.

Containing 301.52 aces, more or less (the "Land").

- 4 Fee. The fee for this LURC is: Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) (the "Fee").
- 5. Term. The term of this LURC shall be: For so long as the Land is developed and used for residential, commercial, and related purposes, including such public purposes as roadways, parks and open space, and schools (the "developed uses"), necessary for development of the Land in accordance with a subdivision plan approved by a local government having authority under New Mexico law to grant such approval (such plat or subdivision plan being the "Approved Plat").
- 6. Restriction on Use; Oil and Gas Operation; Right to Develop Mineral Rights from Other Land.
 - a. Restriction on Use. Neither the State nor anyone claiming under it shall use the surface of the Land to access, explore, develop, mine, or extract geothermal

- resources and minerals reserved pursuant to Patent #4337 except for conducting oil and gas operations as provided below.
- b. Oil and Gas Operations. The State, its lessees and their successors in title and interest may conduct oil and gas operations only from designated well sites on the Land as provided for herein. Such well sites shall be confined to the land area described as Allowable Drilling Area by Exhibit "A". The term "oil and gas operations" includes without limitation all activities using or affecting the use of the surface estate of the Land that are associated with exploration for, drilling, or production of, oil or gas, and accessing the well sites provided for herein, through final reclamation of any part of such Land affected by oil and gas operations.
- Well Sites: Location and Spacing Requirements. The location and spacing of all well sites shall be determined in accordance with 19.15.3.104 NMAC (Well Spacing and Location) (commonly referred to as "OCD Rule 104") and any orders, guidelines, or other directives adopted or issued by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission or the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division effecting oil and gas exploration or production on the Land. Any well site(s) developed within the Allowable Drilling Area shall be drilled consistent with the drilling technology prevalent at the time of development. SLO may approve directional or other drilling methods under areas not in the "Allowable Drilling Area" as long as no surface disturbance outside of the "Allowable Drilling Area" occurs. In addition, oil and gas well sites may not be (a) crossed by roads, easements, or other thoroughfares open to the public, (b) crossed by or be within the boundaries of any easement granted to a public utility or easement relating to the diversion, development, pumping, transportation, or use of water, (c) within a 100 year flood plan as determined for Lea County by the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") or a successor agency designated by the federal government, and (d) within any area designated as a public park, public recreational facility or area, or public "open space" in any Approved Plat.
- d. Right to Develop Mineral Rights from Other Land. Subject to the limitation that neither the State nor its lessees and their successors in title and interest shall conduct any activity relating to the development of the Mineral Rights between the surface of the Land and a depth of five hundred feet (500') below the surface of the Land except as provided for in Paragraph 6, this LURC shall not be construed as a waiver of the right of the State to, explore for, develop, mine, or produce the Mineral Rights, including without limitation, oil and gas with wells drilled on the surface of land other than the Land, including, but not limited to, directional wells bottomed beneath or drilled through any part (other than the surface) of the Land, or by pooling its oil, gas and other mineral interests with lands adjoining the Land in accordance with the laws and regulations of the State.
- e. Application of New Mexico Surface Owners Protection Act. In return for the Commissioner agreeing to the provisions of this Agreement relating to oil and gas exploration and production on the Land, including without limitation Paragraph II

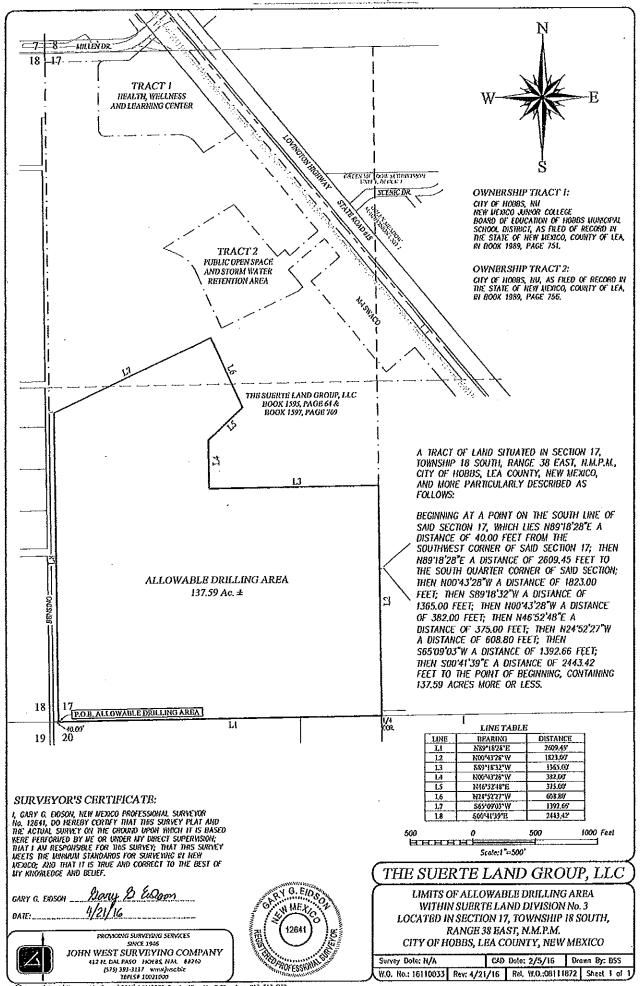
- (D) (2) (Oil and Gas Exploration and Production) of the Exchange Agreement and Paragraph 6 hereof, Suerte, City, NMJC and District expressly agree that neither they nor their successors in interest will be entitled to compensation for the reasonable use of any of the wells, sites or the road or pipeline access to such sites pursuant to the Surface Owners Protection Act, Sections_70-12-1 to 70-10-10 NMSA 1978 by an operator as defined in such Act; provided, however that the foregoing limitation shall not limit or restrict the right of Suerte, City, NMJC and District or their successors in interest to be compensated by an operator for any damages sustained to the surface estate in excess of the reasonable use thereof by an operator conducting oil and gas operations thereon.
- 7. No Waiver, Release, or Relinquishment of Mineral Rights. Except as provided in Paragraphs 6 and 8, nothing herein shall be construed as waiving, releasing or relinquishing any right, title or interest of the State of New Mexico in and to the Mineral Rights in and under and that may be produced from the Land in accordance with the terms of the LURC.
- Limitation on Reservation of Minerals, Geothermal Resources, and Certain Water 8. Rights. The Commissioner acknowledges that Suerte, City, NMJC and District will grade, trench, move and remove materials, and otherwise alter the surface estate of the Land to construct roads, utilities, and building pads in order to develop it for residential, commercial, and related public purposes including such public purposes as roadways, parks and open space, and schools necessary for development of the Land as shown on an Approved Plat. The Commissioner agrees that the reservation to the State provided for in Patent #4337 shall not apply to any caliche, shale, clay, sand, gravel, and rock necessarily used on or removed from the Land in the course of such development and that neither Suerte, City, NMJC nor District shall be liable to the State for the value of said materials; provided, however, that the foregoing limitation of the reservation provided for in this Paragraph 8 shall only apply to those materials necessarily used or removed in the course of developing the Land in accordance with an Approved Plat and shall not entitle either Suerte, City, NMJC or District to sell, barter, or otherwise convey title to such materials to a third party. Should either Suerte, City, NMJC or District remove materials in excess of that amount necessary to develop the Land in accordance with an Approved Plat or sell, barter or otherwise convey title to any materials removed to any third party, Suerte, City, NMJC and District shall be jointly and severally liable to the State for the royalties, and any interest and penalties due thereon, normally charged by the Commissioner for such materials.

Summary:

As a component of the City of Hobbs Effluent Reuse Project, the engineering firm of Molzen Corbin, Inc. (Engineer) has conducted soil boring, percolation testing, groundwater modeling, and water analysis to determine the suitability of using Class 1B reclaimed water for underground storage and recovery (USR) via surface infiltration basins on City owned property adjacent to the treatment facility. Thru USR, reclaimed water available during the cooler months would be allowed to percolate thru the soil into the immediate aquifer and then withdrawn out of the aquifer during the summer months when irrigation demand is at its highest. Results of this pilot study indicate: 1) area ground conditions do permit groundwater recharge; 2) reclaimed water from the Hobbs WWRF consistently meets and exceeds Class 1B criteria; and 3) proposed USR operation would not impact municipal or private water supply wells. On June 3rd, Engineer and City staff met with representatives of the NM Office of the State Engineer (OSE) and NMED Ground Water Quality Bureau (NMED) to present the results of the USR pilot study and review the requirements for obtaining a demonstration permit.

As a result of this meeting, Engineer has prepared a scope of work to prepare a Capability Report, including project design drawings for submission of a USR demonstration project application, and issuance of a ground water permit, for construction of a demonstration USR facility. The demo facility would receive between 100,000 to 250,000 gallons per day (gpd) for a 7- month period (Oct - Apr), with the stored water then being recovered during a 5- month period (May-Sept) using a recovery well. The recovered water would be pumped to the reclamation facility for distribution via the effluent reuse infrastructure.

Work includes the preparation of public notices, incorporation of comments received, and negotiating final conditions of the OSE demonstration permit and the NMED groundwater discharge permit. Included within the scope of work is a contingency for Engineer to provide design related services should additional treatment of the reclaimed water be required to meet NMED conditions of discharge.

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SCOPE DOCUMENT

City of Hobbs, NM Underground Storage and Recovery Demonstration Project Applications REVISED June 10, 2016

1. INTRODUCTION

At the request of the City of Hobbs (City), Molzen Corbin is submitting the following scoping document to prepare applications to the NM Office of the State Engineer (NMOSE) and NM Environment Department (NMED) for an Underground Storage and Recovery (USR) Demonstration/Pilot Project. We understand that, on approval of the scope, the work will be authorized by a Task Order issued by the City under RFP 480-16; Effluent Reuse Project Phase II, and amended agreement between the City and Molzen Corbin. This effort will follow on the heels of the Design Feasibility Study, which is intended to conclude with a project proposal submittal and pre-application meeting with NMOSE and NMED in May 2016. Our efforts in this proposed scope will include: (1) preparing a Capability Report in accordance with the USR guidelines for submittal to NMOSE; (2) prepare demonstration project design drawings and specifications for submittal with the Capability Report, which may include design of additional treatment facilities to meet NMED discharge permit requirements; (3) preparing a USR application on the NMOSEprescribed form; (4) prepare an application for a Groundwater Discharge Permit; (5) meet with representatives of NMOSE and NMED to present and submit the applications; (6) prepare public notices for the USR application and the Discharge Permit application, and; (7) negotiate the final conditions of the USR and Discharge Permits. The project follows the recommendations contained in the City's Effluent Reuse System Preliminary Engineering Report from January 2015. The scope presented herein also reflects discussions with the City including a conference call held on February 25th, 2016.

This scoping document provides a description of services, which are expected to involve the elements outlined below, a breakdown of labor costs, estimated reimbursables (expenses), and a man-hour estimate. Molzen Corbin will be contracting with subconsultant Daniel B. Stephens & Associates (DBS&A) to provide hydrologic services in preparing applications, designing recovery wells and instrumentation, report preparation, and public participation. DBS&A's proposal is attached to this scope document. A summary of estimated costs and an anticipated schedule is provided at the end of the document.

A: USR APPLICATION AND CAPABILITY REPORT

Molzen Corbin and DBS&A would begin the project with a kickoff meeting with the City to define the details of the demonstration project, including the size and duration of the project, recharge and recovery water tie-ins to existing system, level of instrumentation and control, and other details. Based on agreed objectives, the team would complete the USR Demonstration Project application on the OSE-prescribed form and prepare the Capability Report. For reference, Appendix A of the USR regulations detailing the requirements of the Capability Report is attached. The team would coordinate closely with the City on details of the report that require their input. Draft versions of the application and report would be provided to the City for review and comment. The final deliverable for this task would be the completed application and Capability Report suitable for submittal to OSE. We anticipate there will be a

period of a couple of months following submittal during which OSE will request additional information before accepting the application for filing.

B: USR DESIGN DOCUMENTS

The OSE requires engineering design drawings and specifications for the USR facilities, infiltration basins and recovery wells to be included with the Capability Report. The water quality requirements for recharge water have not yet been defined by NMED, but will be prescribed in the discharge permit. If the requirements are more stringent than the existing reclamation facility provides, additional treatment facilities or processes may be required. A contingency allowance for time and materials services not to exceed \$100,000.00 is provided in the fee proposal for additional treatment design if required. The team would prepare a set of plans and specifications with adequate detail for administrative review, with the intention that the documents could be updated to soliciting bids once the application is approved. A design survey will be conducted to prepare topography for the grading plan and to identify and locate important features at the site. We assume that the information collected during the borehole drilling (completed as part of the Design Feasibility Study) will be suitable for providing subsurface geotechnical information. The plans would detail: conveyance and control of the recharge water; layout and grading of the infiltration basins; recovery well drilling and design; recovery water submersible pump, conveyance, control, and tie-in with the existing non-potable distribution system; electrical power and controls; and optionally additional treatment facilities or processes. We assume that there will be no structures involved in the project which will require architecture or structural engineering, but that could change if additional treatment facilities are to be constructed. The construction cost estimates from the 2015 PER would be updated to reflect the current design and layout of the demonstration project. We would review the plans and specifications with the City at the 60% preliminary and 90% final design steps to ensure the City has input on the design process. The final deliverables would be an administrative review level (90% completion) set of plans and specifications to be submitted to OSE with the Capability Report, and a construction cost estimate for City use.

C: NMED GROUNDWATER DISCHARGE PERMIT

The requirement for a Groundwater Discharge Permit will be identified by the NMED in their response to the Notice of Intent, which will be submitted during the Design Feasibility Report phase. If such a permit is required, the team would prepare the application form and associated report. The report contains much of the same information as the Capability Report, including a project overview; description of the reclamation facility treatment process; a summary of effluent discharge characteristics and groundwater conditions; plans and specifications; operations plan focused on the treatment capability; operation and maintenance procedures focused on treatment; groundwater monitoring plan; and contingency plan. It also includes a public participation component. Where possible, the team will use the same information/text in both documents to minimize the effort and cost of preparing the applications. A draft version of the application will be provided to the City and NMED for comments, which will be included in the final document. The final deliverable will be a Discharge Permit application suitable for submitting to NMED. We anticipate there will be a period of a couple of months following submittal during which NMED will request additional information before accepting the application for filing.

D: PUBLIC NOTICES

Both the USR Application and the Groundwater Discharge Permit Application require public notice following submittal and administrative acceptance. DBS&A would prepare draft notices for City and



administrative review, incorporate any comments, coordinate publication in the local paper, and provide affidavits of publication.

E: NEGOTIATE FINAL PERMIT CONDITIONS

Once the applications have been submitted, the team will be available for responding to agency comments and questions as the review process moves forward. Past experience indicates that the duration and level of effort during this phase is difficult to anticipate. We have included adequate time in the budget to cover several meetings and teleconferences, and to prepare a number of written responses to agency questions in coordination with the City. However, if the agency review time or information requests are excessive, or if there is a requirement for major revisions to the applications, Capability Report or design documents, we may need to revisit the budget with the City.

F: MONTHLY PROGRESS REPORTING

Molzen Corbin will provide a monthly progress report to the City for the duration of the project. The team also is available for updates by phone conference at the request of the City. Finally, we have included a presentation to the governing body at an appropriate time during the project to be coordinated with the City.

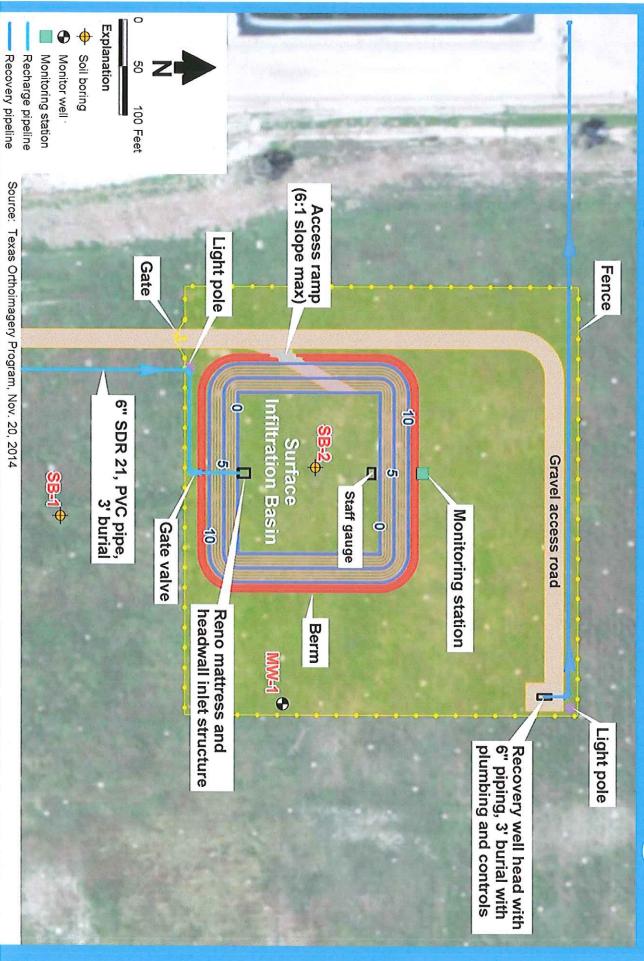

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into on the	day of	f
2016, by and between the CITY OF HOBBS, NEW MEXICO		
(hereinafter referred to as "CITY") and the BOYS & GIRLS	CLUB OF HOBB	S, INC.,
(hereinafter referred to as "CLUB").		

WHEREAS, CLUB has the technical and professional expertise required for the operation of a Summer Recreation Program and has properly equipped recreational facilities in order to perform the services.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES HERETO HEREBY DO COVENANT AND AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

١.

CLUB will act on behalf of CITY to operate a 9-week summer recreation program for 6 to 12-year-olds, and shall perform the necessary services toward promoting these activities in the community, and such services shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- A. Provide a facility to operate a nine-hour summer recreation program to run Monday through Friday, with an agenda that includes recreational, educational, personal improvement and cultural activities.
- B. The Boys & Girls Club summer program will serve in the capacity as being the designated site to accommodate special needs participants during the regular 9-week program hours kept by the facility.
- C. Hire and maintain a minimum of at least eight (8) additional employees to serve as staff for the day program. For the special needs program, an additional employee shall have a background and working knowledge of special need participants and work in the capacity of the special needs participant supervisor during the hours of operation. Additional employees shall also be designated as employees to work with special needs participants as attendance warrants. Staff for all programs arising under this agreement shall be employees of CLUB and shall not be employees of CITY and are not entitled to any City of Hobbs benefits, including, but not limited to, insurance, leave, worker's compensation, and/or retirement.
- D. Provide and obtain Licensing Agreement for the Gus Macker Basketball Tournament. Provide additional staff for the Gus Macker Basketball Tournament to consist of: one (1) Head Buster (referee); and scorekeepers as attendance warrants.

- E. Design and placement of news releases and advertising in the appropriate media, naming CITY as co-sponsor. All advertising shall be reviewed and approved by CITY prior to submission to the media.
- F. Provide reasonable assistance to CITY staff with special summer program activities such as July 4th, on which date at least four (4) of CLUB's summer staff will be required to assist. During the Gus Macker Basketball Tournament an adequate number of scorekeepers will be provided.
- G. Maintain daily records of activities and the number of participants in the program and submit weekly reports to CITY by Monday of the week following the reporting period. In addition, a final report at the conclusion of the summer programs shall be submitted to CITY. Any incidents of serious nature, as determined by the Director of CLUB, shall be immediately reported to CITY.
- H. Perform such other related services as mutually agreed upon by both parties and requiring no additional cost as anticipated by the scope of this Agreement including a final written evaluation of the total program.

It is expressly understood and agreed that CITY is prohibited by the Constitution of New Mexico from directly or indirectly lending or pledging its credit or making any donation to or in aid of any person, association or public or private corporation; this Agreement is intended to employ the services of CLUB, for value received, to carry out the objectives hereof, which are believed to be valid municipal purposes under the laws of the State of New Mexico.

It is expressly understood and agreed that none of these funds shall be used as "prize money" or "cash awards" for participation in activities.

[II].

CITY shall not be obligated to expend funds in excess of Sixty-nine Thousand Dollars (\$69,000.00) during the term of this Agreement. Said "not to exceed" amount shall be further restricted as follows: \$45,000.00 for the overall summer recreation program; an additional \$9,000.00 for the special needs program; an additional \$10,000.00 for the Gus Macker License fee; and an additional \$5,000.00 for the facilitation of the requirements of the Americans with Disability Act. The term of this Agreement is one (1) year, commencing July 1, 2016 and terminating June 30, 2017.

CITY agrees to pay CLUB for approved and accepted expenses, not to exceed Sixty-nine Thousand Dollars (\$69,000.00) for the term of this Agreement. Expenses not pre-approved by CITY are subject to non-payment by CITY.

A payment of Seventeen Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$17,250.00) shall be made from invoice on or about July 1, 2016, with the balance of funds to be paid in two (2) equal payments of Twenty-Five Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy Five Dollars (\$25,875.00) on August 1, 2016 and on May 1, 2017 in accordance with the preceding paragraph and by invoice from CLUB to CITY.

Payments hereunder are further conditioned upon CLUB submitting to CITY comprehensive reports, including a participation report with substantiating documents attached detailing the actual expenditures authorized for specific projects, programs and activities including the number of participants transported to and from the Summer Sports Program at Hobbs High School as required by the proposal submitted by CLUB and the terms of this Agreement.

CLUB agrees that any financial records or audit reports of all data relating to all matters covered by this Agreement shall be made available to CITY upon request.

It is agreed that proprietary records of CLUB, such as audit reports and financial records, are to remain private and as such can only be released to the CITY as outlined above and cannot be released to the public as a public document.

IV.

CLUB agrees to hold CITY free and harmless from any costs determined ineligible by proper audit and CLUB will not enter into any obligation which purports to be binding on CITY in any manner.

At such times and in such form as the City Manager may require, there shall be furnished to CITY such statements, records, reports, data and information as CITY may request pertaining to matters covered by this Agreement. Furthermore, at any time during normal business hours and as often as CITY may deem necessary, there shall be made available to CITY for examination, all records maintained by CLUB with respect to all matters covered by this Agreement; any requested excerpts of transcripts from such records and audits of all data relating to all matters covered by this Agreement subject to the limitations set out above.

V.

CLUB shall obtain, and provide proof thereof to CITY, the following insurance coverage including, but not limited to:

General Liability as follows: Premises, operations, products, completed operations and contractual liability. The limits of liability shall be no less than \$1,000,000.00 combined single limits for bodily injury and property damage.

Workers' Compensation is required along with State statutory employer's liability limits regardless of the number of employees.

The City of Hobbs must be named as an additional insured.

CLUB shall obtain and provide proof thereof to CITY of any other insurance coverage required by the statutes of the State of New Mexico or regulations of any agency of the State of New Mexico governing this type of project.

CLUB covenants and agrees that it will hold and save CITY harmless from any and all liability, damage, expense, cause of action, suits, claims or judgments arising from injury to person(s) or damage to property during the course of execution of this Agreement.

If any part or portion of this Agreement shall be in violation of the laws or Constitution of New Mexico, only such part or portion hereof shall be invalidated thereby, and any monies paid by CITY there under shall be repaid to CITY by CLUB, but all other portions hereof shall remain valid and enforceable.

This Agreement shall continue in force for one (1) year, with an option to renew for one (1) additional one (1) year term. This Agreement may be canceled by either party after giving sixty (60) days' notice to the other. Such notice shall be in writing and shall be considered given when delivered to the Chief Administrative Officer of the other party.
