Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Commissioner Fields delivered the invocation and Commissioner Calderón led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Gerth moved the minutes of the regular meeting of April 7, 2025, to be approved as written. Commissioner Penick seconded the motion and roll call vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Mills yes, Fields yes, Calderón yes, Penick yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried.

Proclamations and Awards of Merit

Mayor Cobb proclaimed the month of April, 2025, as "FAIR HOUSING MONTH" in the City of Hobbs. He stated that this proclamation serves as a reaffirmation of the City's commitment, alongside local organizations, city staff, and the City Commission to continuously work toward improving housing conditions in the community. Mayor Cobb emphasized the importance of ensuring fair and equal treatment for all citizens in matters of housing, regardless of race, religion, sex, national origin, handicap, or family status.

Mr. Manny Gomez, City Manager, recognized the following employees for their Milestone Service Awards for the month of April, 2025:

Mr. Gomez thanked the Commission for recognizing the employees. He reviewed highlights about the work of each employee. He expressed gratitude to each employee for their hard work and also thanked the employees' families for their contributions to the organization.

Public Comments

Ms. Evelyn Nunez, Community Service Assistant of Hobbs, reminded the public of the community clean-up, which will also be a celebration of Earth day, that will be held at Washington Park on April 22, 2025 at 4p.m. near the Soccer Complex. She also noted that additional clean-up events and activities are planned for May in connection with the upcoming Free Dumpster Day.

Mr. Freddy Solis-Littlejohn, Veterans Officer with the New Mexico Department of Veterans Services, shared information about a recently passed law that provides a tax exemption for Veterans based on their disability rating. He offered his assistance in printing the necessary certificates for eligible Veterans, and stated he is available to help Monday through Friday, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. He can be reached at 575-241-0714 and the office is located at 2120 North Alto.

Ms. Nicki Lawless, Library Director, recognized Ms. Carolina Greene, a dedicated member of the Hobbs Public Library Board for 25 years of outstanding service. Ms. Lawless highlighted Ms. Greene's many accomplishments, both as an educator and as a devoted supporter of the Library. Ms. Greene began her service with the Hobbs Public Library in April 2000, following a 25-year career in education from 1975 to 2000, during which she served as both a teacher and a principal in the Hobbs School District. She soon transitioned from shaping minds in the classroom to playing a key role in guiding the growth and development of the library. Throughout her career and board service, Ms. Greene has exemplified a steadfast commitment to lifelong learning and community engagement. Her tenure has spanned numerous significant milestones at the Library, including working alongside past directors and supporting the transition to a new Library Director. In recognition of her contributions, the City of Hobbs presented Ms. Greene with a 25-Year Commemorative Coin.

Ms. Patricia Grovey Evans, Founder and Executive Director of Child and Family Services, Inc., addressed the Commission to express her gratitude for the continued support and partnership with the City of Hobbs over many years. She announced the organization is celebrating 40 years of service to the community and emphasized the Commission's consistent support has played a vital role in providing safe, high-quality environments where children can learn, grow and thrive. She stated the organization aims to give special recognition to community members who have made a significant impact. She extended her appreciation and specifically recognized Mayor Sam Cobb, Commissioner Joe Calderón, Commissioner Finn Smith and Commissioner Larron Fields, thanking them for being champions of early childhood development.

Mr. Marcus Sparenberg, also a representative of Child and Family Services, extended an invitation to the Mayor and Commission to attend the Children's Champions Luncheon scheduled for Tuesday, April 29, 2025, from 1:00 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. at Rockwind Grill.

Discussion

Presentation of Hobbs Fire Department 2024 Annual Report

Mr. Mark Doporto, Fire Chief, presented the City of Hobbs Fire Department Annual Report for 2024. He began the presentation by reading the department's mission and vision statements. The mission focuses on preservation, education, and professionalism in service to the Hobbs community. The vision outlines a commitment to preserving life, property, and the environment through education and empowerment of both department personnel and the public. It also emphasizes being progressive in the face of adversity and change, and building public confidence through professionalism, pride, and quality service.

Chief Doporto reviewed key departmental information, including apparatus, personnel, and training data. He provided statistics on total fire responses, structure fires, estimated losses, false alarms, and dispatch times. Additional EMS statistics were presented, including airport transfers and billing information.

In response to an inquiry from Mayor Cobb, Chief Doporto provided an update on the development of the new training facility for the Hobbs Fire Department. He reported that the department has been awarded \$1.5 million through a capital outlay project. Chief Doporto expressed optimism that construction could begin in the coming months after the design is complete, with an estimated completion timeline of approximately one year after groundbreaking.

In response to Commissioner Smith's inquiry regarding the statistics on total loss and the assessed values of structures in Hobbs, Chief Doporto explained the Fire Marshal's Office, which also serves as the Fire Investigation Division, utilizes a spreadsheet tool provided by insurance companies. This tool offers adjusted estimates for the total losses associated with each fire incident.

In further reply to Commissioner Smith's question, Chief Doporto stated the EMS amounts billed and collected were for the year, meaning that more was collected during the year than billed out.

Commissioner Penick commented on Chief Doporto's presentation, describing it as thorough and informative. He expressed his appreciation for the detailed information provided and noted that he was particularly impressed with the Hobbs Fire Department's response time statistics.

Commissioner Fields also expressed his appreciation for Chief Doporto's presentation, stating he was impressed with the information shared and thanked the Chief for his work.

Action Items

Resolution No. 7608 - Adopting Budget Adjustment #4 for Fiscal Year 2024-2025

Mr. Toby Spears, Finance Director, presented Budget Adjustment #4 for the current fiscal year. He explained that the fiscal budget for the City of Hobbs is adopted by resolution and reviewed and approved by the Department of Finance & Administration (DFA). The budget is prepared prior to the beginning of the fiscal year; however, periodic adjustments are necessary to account for unforeseen items or emerging issues during the year.

Mr. Spears noted the proposed adjustment includes changes to both revenue and expenses, as well as inter-fund transfers. A summary of the adjusted funds is attached to the resolution which includes:

- Total Expense Increase: \$2,689,839.89
- Total Revenue Increase: \$598,950.50
- Budgeted Ending Cash Balance (All Funds): \$99,272,724.02
- General Fund Reserve Reduction: From 58% to 56%

Following Commission approval, the adjustment will be submitted to DFA for final approval.

In response to an inquiry from Commissioner Penick, Mr. Spears explained the function of the Enterprise Fund. He noted it operates as a self-sufficient fund specifically for water and sewer services. Revenues collected through water and sewer rates are directed into the fund balance, which is then used to support salaries, benefits, and other operational expenses related to those services. Mr. Spears clarified that the Enterprise Fund is separate from the general revenue fund.

Mayor Cobb commented on the City's current financial reserve levels, noting that while the State of New Mexico requires municipalities to maintain a minimum reserve of 1/12 (or 8.33%), the City of Hobbs adopted an ordinance several years ago setting a higher internal standard to not drop below 30%. He commended the Finance Department and City staff for their efforts, stating that the City's current reserve level of 56% reflects strong financial stewardship. He emphasized the importance of maintaining these reserves, especially given the City's position within a cyclical economy. He reminded everyone that reserves are designed to support essential needs such as health insurance, salaries, and other operational costs during economic downturns, and encouraged continued vigilance in financial planning.

In response to an inquiry from Commissioner Smith, Mr. Spears explained the adjustment related to workers' compensation insurance which includes a salary-related increase, which is being allocated across various special revenue funds. This

approach allows the City to accurately charge salary expenses to the appropriate funding sources. Mr. Spears noted that these allocations are then consolidated into a trust fund, ensuring proper financial tracking and transparency across the City's accounts.

Following a lengthy discussion, Commissioner Penick moved to approve Resolution No. 7608 as presented. Commissioner Fields seconded the motion and roll call vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Mills yes, Fields yes, Calderón yes, Penick yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. A copy of the resolution and supporting documentation are attached.

Resolution No. 7609 - Authorizing an Allocation of Lodgers' Tax to Fund Various Events for FY 2025

Mr. Spears stated the Lodgers' Tax Board met on April 9, 2025, and reviewed funding requests for various events. The board recommended allocations based on available funds within the Lodgers' Tax Fund. A total of \$573,214.82 was recommended for approval by the Board, with City staff recommending an adjusted total of \$591,414.82, reflecting full funding for the Hobbs Hispano Chamber Foundation request, which initially failed due to a lack of quorum. A summary of the recommended allocations is as follows:

The FY 2025 Lodgers' Tax Revenue is projected to be \$1,750,000.00.

There being no discussion, Commissioner Calderón moved to approve Resolution No. 7609 with the funding amounts as recommended by staff. Commissioner Gerth seconded the motion and roll call vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Mills yes, Fields yes, Calderón yes, Penick yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. A copy of the resolution and supporting documentation are attached.

Consideration of Approval of Replacement of the Eagle Intelligence Center Video Wall System with Activu Corporation in the Amount of \$474,851.69

Mr. Steven Blandin, Technology Administrator at the Hobbs Police Department, presented a request to replace the video wall system at the Eagle Intelligence Center located at the HPD Annex, 301 North Dalmont St. The existing system, installed in 2014, is outdated with multiple display units no longer operational and no longer supported.

The proposed upgrade includes:

- Replacement of all system control hardware and wiring
- Expansion to ten 55" displays
- Installation of a custom floor-mounted bracket
- Upgraded workstations with dual ultra-wide PC monitors
- Procurement through the HGAC cooperative purchasing program

Project Cost Breakdown:

- Display Devices: \$117,220.53
- Processors & Control Hardware: \$21,076.58
- Audio System: \$6,632.42
- Cable/Wire/Racks: \$1,194.84
- Furniture: \$99,003.34
- Software: \$62,605.00
- Labor, Travel, Shipping, Logistics: \$152,840.48
- Support: \$16,331.28
- One-time Discount: -\$16,200.00
- Applicable Tax: \$14,147.22
- Total Projected Cost: \$474,851.69

Mayor Cobb commented the quantity and volume of video footage has expanded exponentially since 2014, citing the growing number of cameras installed in City parks, traffic intersections and other public areas. He emphasized this increase highlights the need for substantial data storage and processing capacity.

Mr. Blandin presented several photos illustrating the current layout and provided an overview of where the new screens will be installed within that framework.

In response to Commissioner Penick's inquiry about the role of cameras in solving crimes, Mr. Blandin explained that the cameras are used to relay real-time information to responding officers. He stated this capability not only aids in solving crimes but also enables officers to actively engage suspects during an incident and pursue them in ongoing cases.

There being no further discussion, Commissioner Penick moved to approve the Replacement of the Eagle Intelligence Center Video Wall System with Activu Corporation in the amount of \$474,851.69. Commissioner Gerth seconded the

motion and roll call vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Mills yes, Fields yes, Calderón yes, Penick yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. A copy of the supporting documentation is attached.

Comments by City Commissioners, City Manager

Mr. Manny Gomez reminded the community and local Veterans about the opportunity to have a commemorative brick paver placed at the Veterans Memorial located on Jack Gomez Boulevard. He stated the deadline to submit applications is April 28, 2025. Applications are available on the City of Hobbs website (hobbsnm.org) or can be picked up in person at Hobbs Fire Department Station 1. This service is free of charge for Veterans who are current residents of Lea County or who were residents at the time of their enlistment.

Mr. Gomez reminded the community about the upcoming Gus Macker 3-on-3 Basketball Tournament taking place on April 26-27, 2025, at 200 East Broadway, in the east employee parking lot at City Hall. In addition to the basketball games, the event will feature various activities and vendors throughout the weekend.

Mr. Gomez informed the Commission and the public that he received an email from the Chairperson of the American Association of Code Enforcement (AACE) announcing a significant achievement for the City of Hobbs. The Code Enforcement Division of the Hobbs Police Department has become the first agency in the State of New Mexico, and the 12th agency in the nation, to receive agency accreditation from the AACE. He stated the City of Hobbs Community Services Division is recognized as a healthy agency that has demonstrated a level of accountability that should bolster public trust. Mr. Gomez stated a more formal presentation of this accomplishment will take place in the near future when an official letter or certificate is received.

Commissioner Gerth expressed his appreciation for the Code Enforcement Division, noting that he contacts them more frequently than any other department. He commended the team for being highly citizen-oriented and for consistently putting the community first. He thanked the division for their dedication, professionalism, and for remaining cordial and respectful even during the most challenging callouts.

Commissioner Fields expressed his appreciation to Code Enforcement for their continued hard work, noting that he frequently contacts them regarding efforts to keep the City clean. He also thanked Chief Mark Doporto for the Annual Fire Report, describing it as highly informative. Additionally, he recognized Mr. Toby Spears, Finance Director, for his efforts in keeping the Commission and public well-informed about the City's financial status.

Commissioner Fields extended his thanks to Ms. Patricia Grovey Evans for the invitation to the upcoming luncheon, emphasizing the importance of prioritizing children in the community. He also shared his excitement about the Midwest Street

project, noting that it is officially underway. He encouraged the public to remain patient with any disruptions in the area during construction.

Commissioner Calderón expressed his gratitude to Ms. Shelia Baker and the General Services Department for their efforts in maintaining the City's streets. He noted that the streets are looking exceptionally well and commended Ms. Baker for the outstanding job she and her team are doing.

Commissioner Penick expressed his appreciation to the Hobbs Fire Department and its staff, commending the high level of professionalism within which the department operates. He noted their commitment to public safety is evident in their consistently quick response times and praised their efforts in serving the community with excellence.

Mayor Cobb thanked Ms. Patricia Grovey Evans, Director of Child and Family Services, for the invitation to the upcoming luncheon. He shared he will be unable to attend due to travel but will have a family representative present on his behalf. Mayor Cobb noted he will be traveling with Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham and a delegation of New Mexicans next week, representing Hobbs and Lea County.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business or comments, Commissioner Calderón moved that the meeting adjourn. Commissioner Gerth seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Mills yes, Fields yes, Calderón yes, Penick yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned at 7:15 p.m.

MARKET RATE SINGLE FAMILY DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into on this 5th day of May 2025 by and between the City of Hobbs, New Mexico, a municipal corporation (hereinafter "City"); and **Sombre Homes, 1113 W Canterbury St, Hobbs, NM 88242**, (hereinafter "Developer") for the purpose of delivering Housing Developer Services to be provided to the City.

RECITALS:

** The City desires to contract with a Market Rate Single Family Development Company to deliver Single Family Market Rate Housing to the Citizens of Hobbs, New Mexico.

** Developer has submitted a proposal to the City to deliver the required Market Rate Single Family Housing, to be produced within 365 days of ratification of this agreement, within the City of Hobbs and the extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) boundary.

** Any outstanding Development Agreements between the Developer and the City of Hobbs concerning the production of Market Rate Single Family Housing shall become null and void upon the ratification of this agreement herewith.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Hobbs and Developer do hereby agree as follows:

A. Work To Be Performed.

1. The Developer shall furnish to the City its Professional Housing Developer Services for certain work regarding the Market Rate Single Family Housing. All single-family structures completed under this agreement shall be located within the City of Hobbs and the ETJ boundaries and shall have received a certificate of occupancy after ratification of this agreement.

2. Developer shall furnish to City its professional Housing Developer Services as provided by this Agreement. The Developer shall produce and deliver to the public Market-Rate Single-Family Housing Units in Hobbs. Produced Units receiving an infrastructure incentive reimbursement shall not now or in the future be utilized in a pecuniary manner by renting, leasing, exchanging, or bartering habitation privileges to the property for a period of no less than 30 days at a time.

3. Specific activities required are to develop privately owned real property in the City, including designing, building, and transferring to the public individual market rate single-family housing units. The City's subsidy may include any or all of the following funding assistance from the City:

Incentives are available for installed public municipal infrastructure only, providing compliance with:

- a. Incentive not to exceed per square footage basis:
 - i. \$20.00 per sq. ft. in an in-fill areas
 - ii. \$15.00 per sq. ft. in new residential areas
 - iii. Calculation based on living area only
- b. Incentive not to exceed per unit basis:
 - i. \$17,000.00 per single family unit within an in-fill area
 - ii. \$15,000.00 per single family unit
 - iii. \$7,500 per multi-family unit

- c. Incentive not to exceed fair share per linear foot of infrastructure basis:
 - i. **\$255.00 per linear front footage** of complete public infrastructure, and further broken down as follows:
 - 1. **Water (\$45.00 / lf):**
 - a. Forty-Five dollars (\$45.00) per equivalent front foot of lot to which water service is provided (8" minimum service single family & 10" minimum service for multi-family);
 - 2. **Sewer (\$50.00 / lf):**
 - a. Fifty dollars (\$50.00) per equivalent front foot of lot to which sewer service is provided (8" minimum service single family & 10" minimum service for multi-family);
 - 3. **Street (\$125.00 / lf):**
 - a. One Hundred Twenty-Five dollars (\$125.00) per equivalent front foot of lot to which street is provided (built to Minor Residential standards as defined within the City of Hobbs Major Thoroughfare Plan);
 - 4. **Sidewalk: (\$35.00 / lf):**
 - a. Thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) per equivalent front foot of lot to which sidewalk is provided;

Based on the quantities of required publicly owned infrastructure installed supporting the project, the City Engineer shall determine if the value of the infrastructure is adequate as an equal exchange of value for the amount of City subsidy contributed to the market rate single-family housing unit. The City Engineer shall resolve any issues concerning value or extent of infrastructure and amount of square footage of constructed housing units. Specifically, the City Engineer will determine the value or unit costs of the publicly owned infrastructure according to any City of Hobbs Annual Pavement/Concrete/Utility Contracts or public infrastructure projects and estimates.

B. Payment for Services.

- 1) The City shall pay for said services at the rates agreed to and as specified above in the Infrastructure details, as shown herein. The City will not pay for any unit until a certificate of occupancy is issued based on this Agreement.
- 2) The total compensation to be paid to the Developer during the term of this Agreement shall not exceed **Forty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000.00)**, unless the Agreement is amended by the City Commission.
- 3) The City subsidy shall be paid when each individual single-family unit is complete and a certificate of occupancy (C.O.) is issued, provided the certificate of occupancy for the unit is issued after ratification of this agreement. Payment will be made within fifteen (15) days following a written request from the Developer and upon City inspection of project completion.

4) Produced Units receiving an infrastructure incentive reimbursement shall not now or in the future be utilized in a pecuniary manner by renting, leasing, exchanging or bartering habitation privileges to the property for a period of no less than 30 days at a time. Such usage either now or in the future, for a period not to exceed 10 years from date of issuance of a certificate of occupancy (C.O.), shall require Developer to return any incentive funds received for any unit thus utilized, upon demand by the City. Developer shall record a "Declaration of Restrictive Covenants", attached hereto as Exhibit 2, to restrict such usage and to notify parties involved in future conveyances.

C. Construction Requirements.

High Wind Events: During high wind events, contractors must implement effective mitigation measures and best management practices (BMPs) to minimize blowing trash and airborne dust. This includes deploying wind barriers such as fencing or tarps around work areas, securing loose materials and debris with weighted coverings, and promptly collecting and disposing of waste to prevent it from becoming windborne. Additionally, contractors should apply water or soil stabilizers to exposed surfaces to suppress dust and adjust work schedules to avoid high-risk activities during extreme wind conditions. Regular site inspections and immediate corrective actions ensure compliance with environmental regulations and protect surrounding communities from the impacts of wind-driven debris and dust.

D. Assignment of Agreement.

This Section refers to assignability of this Agreement, and not to assignability of the Project to be developed for housing. Developer shall not assign or transfer any interest in this Agreement. Except that Developer is permitted, upon City approval, to assign its interest to a Partnership or Corporation in which the Developer is the principal party or to an affiliated company, working with the Developer on the Project. Subject to the foregoing provision, this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties to this Agreement and their respective successors and assigns; provided that upon any assignment of this Agreement by either party, the other party shall not be released from any obligation under, or liability accruing pursuant to this Agreement. Consent shall not unreasonably be withheld by either party.

E. Insurance Requirements and Hold Harmless Provision.

1. Developer agrees to obtain and maintain appropriate insurance during the course of the development of market rate single family housing with the City of Hobbs, as follows, and shall indemnify and hold harmless City, its employees, agents, officers and officials from any and all claims, losses, causes of action, and/or liabilities resulting from the conduct, negligence, errors or omissions of Developer or any employee or agent of Developer while engaged in performing the services called for herein.

2. The Developer shall maintain insurance coverage for General Liability, Automobile Liability, Errors and Omissions Insurance, and Workers' Compensation, subject to review and approval of the City Attorney.

F. Governing Law and Provisions.

1. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Mexico. Jurisdiction and venue relating to any litigation or dispute arising out of this Agreement shall be in the District Court of Lea County, New Mexico, only. If any part of this contract shall be deemed in violation of the laws or Constitution of New Mexico, only such part thereof shall be thereby invalidated, and all other parts hereof shall remain valid and enforceable.

2. If any party is found by a court to have breached this Agreement, the breaching party agrees to pay all reasonable costs, attorney's fees and expenses that shall be made or incurred by another party in enforcing any covenant or provision of this Agreement, including the expenses of in-house counsel.

G. Final Payment and Release of Claims.

1. Developer, upon final payment of all amounts due under this Agreement, releases the City and its officers and employees from all liabilities, claims and obligations whatsoever arising from or under this Agreement.

2. City, upon Developer's final completion of all work items and covenants required of the Developer under this Agreement, shall release the Developer from all liabilities, claims and obligations whatsoever arising from or under this Agreement, on the day that is ten (10) years following the date of the City's issuance of a final certificate of occupancy on the Project.

H. Amendments.

This Agreement shall not be altered, changed, or amended except by a written instrument approved and executed by both parties hereto.

I. Breach.

1. The following events constitute a breach of this Agreement by Developer:
 - a) Developer's failure to perform or comply with any of the terms, conditions or provisions of this Agreement.
2. The following events constitute a breach of this Agreement by City:
 - a) City's failure to perform or comply with any of the terms, conditions or provisions of this Agreement, including making timely and appropriate payments to the Developer.

J. Remedies Upon Breach.

1. Any party may sue to collect any and all damages that may accrue by virtue of the breach of this Agreement.
2. If any party is found by a court to have breached this Agreement, the breaching party agrees to pay all reasonable costs, attorney's fees and expenses that shall be made or incurred by another party in enforcing any covenant or provision of this Agreement.

K. Termination.

This Agreement shall be terminated upon the completion of all terms herein specified or 365 days from date of ratification whichever comes first. A request for infrastructure reimbursement, for a qualified unit produced within the terms of this agreement, received after the Termination Date of this agreement will not be eligible for payment.

L. Notice.

All notices given pursuant to or in connection with this Agreement shall be made in writing and posted by regular mail, postage prepaid, to the City, ATTN: City Attorney, 200 E. Broadway, Hobbs, NM 88240; to Developer ATTN: **Sombre Homes, 1113 W Canterbury St, Hobbs, NM 88242** and to such other address as requested by either party. Notice shall be deemed to be received on the fifth day following posting.

M. Entire Agreement.

The foregoing constitutes the entire agreement between the parties hereto and may be modified only in writing by the parties hereto.

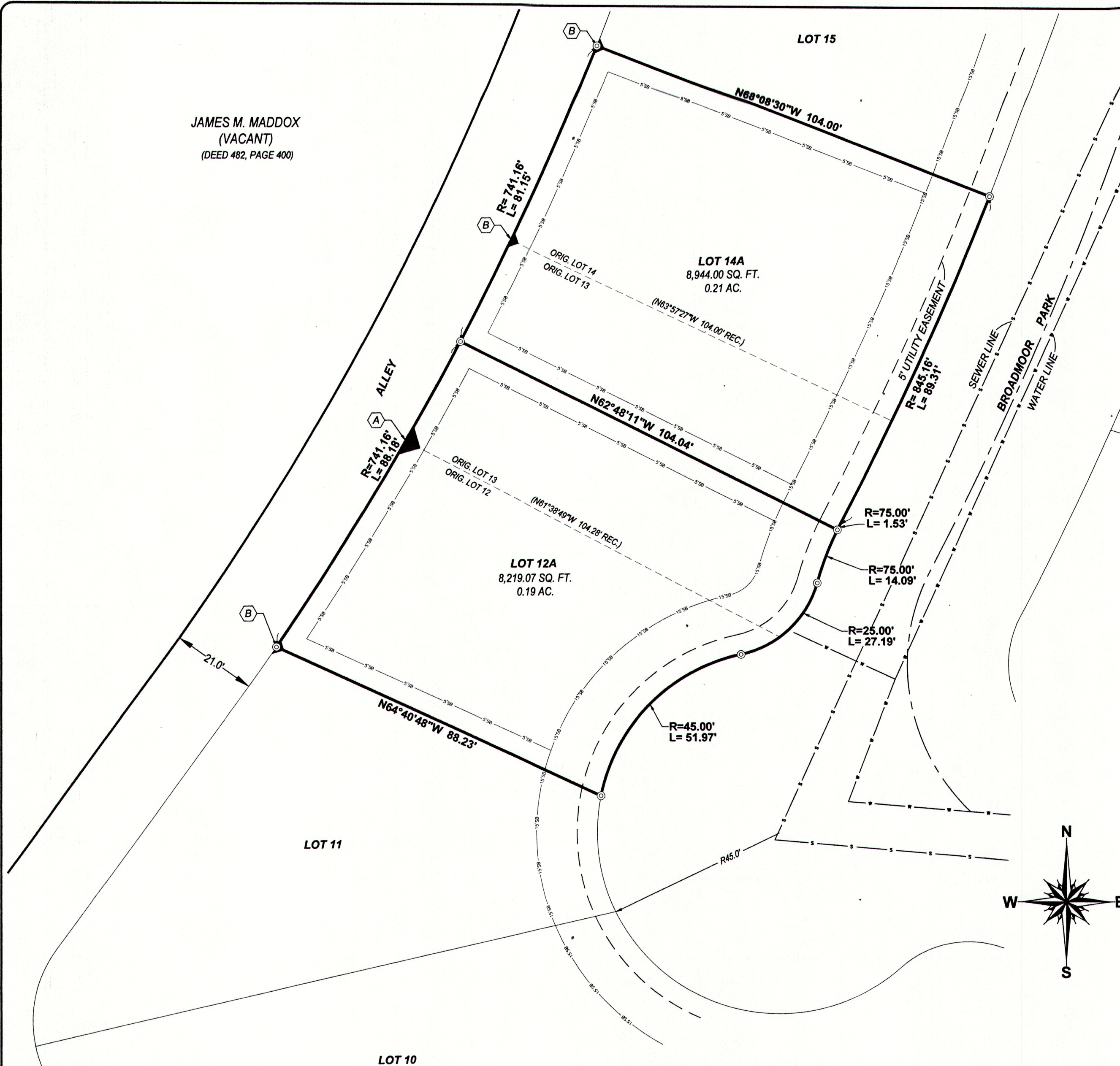

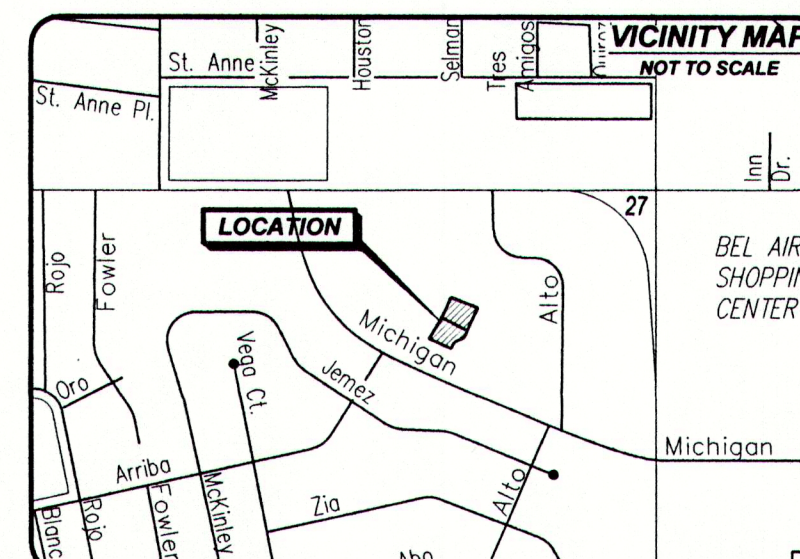

WHEREAS, the City and County entered into a Memorandum of Agreement on December 5th, 2022 (“2022 Agreement”), attached hereto and incorporated herein, wherein the City accepted the County’s grant of \$250,000.00 for operational and capital expenditures to expand spay and neuter programs and services in the City; and

WHEREAS, there remains a balance of \$184,410.72 of the grant; the spay and neuter program continues to provide services to the City and the County;

WHEREAS, the 2022 Agreement expired on June 30, 2024, and the City and County have entered into negotiations on a new agreement and now mutually seek an extension of the 2022 Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the 2022 Agreement on Page 2 states, “[t]he foregoing constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and may be modified only in writing signed by both Parties. Amendments and alterations to this Memorandum of Agreement after execution may only be made in writing signed by both parties.”; and

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants, promises, and agreements herein contained, and for other good and valuable consideration, the City and the County agree to amend the titled “Agreement” and “Term” clauses in the 2022 Agreement as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. The City shall use the remaining balance of \$184,410.72 of the grant.
2. The City shall use the grant funds for operational and capital expenditures to expand spay and neuter programs.
3. The City will use the grant funds by June 30, 2026.
4. The City will return any unused grant funds to the County by June 30, 2026.

TERM

This Memorandum of Agreement shall continue in full force and effect until the grant funds have been used or June 30, 2026, whichever occurs first.



Summary:

The Parks and Open Space Department has been working on plans to make improvements and replace playground equipment at Clover Park, 1300 W. Central Ave. The current equipment is outdated, showing significant signs of wear and deterioration, and replacement parts are no longer available. Due to these issues, the decision was made to move forward with a full replacement.

The new playground will be designed for children aged 5–12 and will feature updated play elements. Planned amenities include a play structure with climbers and two slides. Other elements within the park are swings, a spinner, a climbing wall. Also being added are two metal-roofed pavilions equipped with picnic tables to enhance the park's usability for families and community gatherings. The upgrades will also include new concrete paths that will connect pavilions and playground for ease of access and accessibility. Turf improvements will also be made along with Xeriscaping with colorful plants to provide a buffer zone along the edge of the streets. This upgrade aims to provide a safer, more engaging, and accessible recreational space for local residents.

Playground, concrete, and pavilions will be installed by a contractor. Xeriscaping, plants, turf and irrigation system upgrades will be completed by city staff.

Summary:

Bids were opened at 2:00 PM on Thursday, April 10, 2025, for the Phase 12 Waterline Replacement Project. The project consists of furnishing and installing approximately 15,929 LF of 6-inch C900 PVC waterline, 77 LF of 8-inch C900 PVC waterline, 776 LF of 12-inch C900 PVC waterline, water service lines, gate valves, and all related appurtenances. This project primarily focuses on removing and replacing undersized and aging waterline infrastructure at multiple locations throughout the City of Hobbs. The project also includes the installation of one (1) new twenty-four inch (24") water valve and the replacement of one (1) existing twenty-four inch (24") along the east side of Lovington Hwy, between W. Bender & W. Coal.

An advertisement was placed in the local newspaper on February 23, 2025. Three bids were submitted.

Bids were opened for the City of Hobbs Phase 12 Waterline Replacement Project on April 10, 2025, at 200 E Broadway St., Hobbs, NM 88240. Three bids were received for the project and the bid packages were determined to be complete at the time of bid opening. The apparent low bidder was *Entrench, Inc.* The total of the **Bids** ranged from three million, eight hundred five thousand, three hundred seventy-three dollars and zero cents (\$3,805,373.00) to five million, three hundred three thousand, forty-two dollars and fifty cents (\$5,303,042.50). There were not any bid alternatives included on this project.

Based on a review of the base bid, the low bidder has been identified as responsive, thus Souder, Miller & Associates (SMA) recommends awarding the project to *Entrench, Inc.*, with a **total recommended amount** of three million, eight hundred five thousand, three hundred seventy-three dollars and zero cents (\$3,805,373.00), **not including NMGR**T).

Souder, Miller & Associates (SMA) investigated *Entrench, Inc.*'s past experience. The references provided by *Entrench, Inc.*, contacted by SMA, provided good feedback on their quality of work. Please refer to the References Contacted after the bid opening.

If City of Hobbs agrees with SMA's recommendation to award the project, City of Hobbs should "tentatively" award the construction contract to *Entrench, Inc.* Once authorization is received, the attached Agreement between Owner and Contractor and Notice of Award for *Entrench, Inc.*, needs to be signed. The contractor will then have 15 days to deliver insurance, performance and payment bonds. After City of Hobbs receives all items from the Contractor, the Notice to Proceed can be signed by City of Hobbs and sent to the Contractor.




